Here's How:

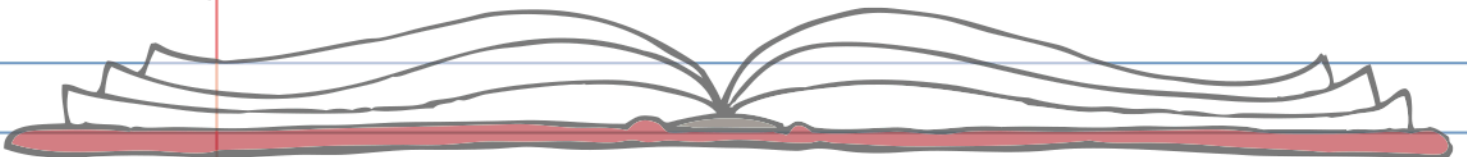
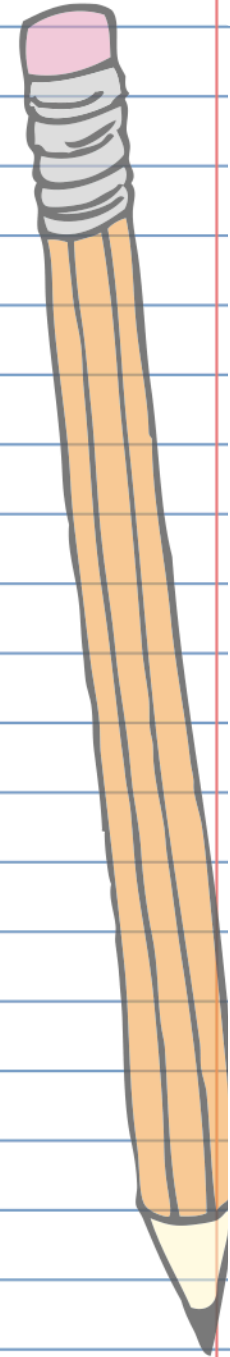
Offer positive reinforcement to your young reader, read out loud--to them, with them, and have them read to you, and lead by example--demonstrate your love of reading by reading yourself.
